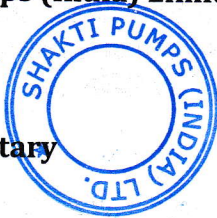

Vaccination Can't be Imposed; Curbs on Unvaxxed Must be Reasonable: SC

Apex court asks states to scale down vaccine mandates with an option to reimpose them if the threat emerges again

New Delhi: No one can be forced to take vaccines in violation of one's bodily integrity and personal autonomy, the Supreme Court has ruled. "Bodily integrity is protected under Article 21 (right to life). No one can be forced to get vaccinated," the bench said in a ruling on Monday.

"Persons who are keen not to be vaccinated on account of personal beliefs or preferences can avoid vaccination, without anyone physically compelling them to be vaccinated." However, SC said the state can impose some restrictions on the unvaccinated in the interest of the general public, but they would have to be reasonable and proportionate to threat the unvaccinated

pose to the community. The bench accordingly directed all state governments to scale back their vaccine mandates to ensure that they were reasonable. If the situation warranted, governments could reimpose them, it said.

Various state governments have come up with their own vaccine mandates. Some have restricted access to public spaces to the unvaccinated. Some others have said that they would be denied government jobs. These were challenged in SC. The bench dubbed those which restrict the unvaccinated from public spaces as disproportionate and sought a review of such mandates in view of the falling Covid-19 threat.

Governments, central and state, failed to prove that the unvaccinated spread the virus more than the vaccinated. There is no data to warrant curbs on them accessing public spaces, the bench said.

Till the numbers are low, we suggest that no restriction is imposed on individuals on access to public areas or these be recalled if already not done, it said. The bench did not

find any unconstitutionality in the Centre's extant vaccination policy. They were as per industry practices and standards followed the world over, including the decision to vaccinate children. "The court is satisfied that the current vaccine policy cannot be said to be manifestly arbitrary."

The bench asked the government to make public all information received so far on adverse effects from vaccinations. This would only promote public confidence in the vaccinations, it said. "Subject to the privacy of individuals... all data must be made available to the public without further delay," it said. This would cover data regarding previous trials and any future trials. The bench refused to examine the procedures followed by DCGI's special expert committee in approving vaccines.

JIGNESH MEVANI BAIL CASE Gauhati HC Stays Barpeta Court Observations On Assam Police

Guwahati: The Gauhati HC has stayed two observations made by the Barpeta session's court while it granted bail to Gujarat Independent MLA Jignesh Mevani. The HC said that the Assam government was free to challenge the bail order and fixed the next hearing for May 27.

Assam advocate general Deajit Lon Saikia told journalists in Guwahati on Monday that HC has served a notice to Mevani to appear on May 27. "The court has asked that the notice be delivered to Mevani through registered post and has allowed even a messenger from Assam Police or Gujarat Police to deliver the notice to Mevani," Saikia said. Justice Devashis Baruah accepted the state's argument that certain remarks on the police force not only demoralised it but also casts aspersion on the force.

"The learned sessions judge... made certain observations to the effect which had no relevance to the consideration of the bail application," the HC said while staying the observations. The HC, however, added, "the instant order may not be construed in any manner as a stay to the grant of bail by the learned sessions judge."

MNS Chief Drops Plan to Hold 'Maha Aartis' on Eid

Mumbai: The Maharashtra Navnirman Sena (MNS) has cancelled plans to hold 'Maha Aartis' on Akshaya Tritiya — which falls on Tuesday, the same day as Eid.

Addressing his supporters, MNS chief Raj Thackeray tweeted: "Tomorrow is Eid... The Muslim community should celebrate this festival in happiness. Do not celebrate Akshaya Tritiya by holding Maha Aartis anywhere (in the state). We do not want to create obstacles in anyone's festival."

The MNS chief also seemed to put his call for putting up loudspeakers blaring Hanuman Chalisa outside Mosques on May 4 on hold. "The issue of loudspeakers is not religious but social and what to do about it will be revealed tomorrow through Twitter," he tweeted.

The MNS call for the Maha

Aartis to be held on the same day as Eid had put the Maharashtra government and the police machinery on alert. This is because Maha Aartis done in the past have led to violence.

A report of the BN Sri Krishna Commission, formed in the wake

of one of the worst Hindu-Muslim riots (in 1992-93), had faulted the government and the police for letting the BJP and the Shiv Sena organise Maha Aartis in Mumbai, identifying it as one of the main reasons for the riots.

NCP Chief's Kin Refuses to Accept Award from Koshyari

Mumbai: Rajendra Pawar, a nephew of NCP chief Sharad Pawar, on Monday refused to take an award from Maharashtra Governor Bhagat Singh Koshyari. Rajendra Pawar is the son of NCP chief's eldest brother late Appasaheb Pawar and father of Rohit Pawar, an MLA from the Karjat-Jamkhed constituency.

Governor Koshyari was to confer the Dr Panjabrao Deshmukh Krishi Ratna Award in Nashik on Monday, when Rajendra Pawar refused to attend the ceremony. Speaking to reporters later,

he said, "There has been a systematic attempt to hurt Maharashtra's pride in the last few days. Great people like Mahatma Phule and Savitribai, who opened the doors of education to everyone, have been the subject of very slanderous comments. If people, who don't know about Maharashtra's history and encourage people to create anarchy like situation in the state, are the ones giving an award, how can I accept it?"

While Pawar did not take the name of Governor, he was indirectly referring to the latter as Koshyari had made comments on Phule and Savitribai recently.

Rahul Gandhi in Nepal on 5-Day Private Visit

Kathmandu: Congress leader Rahul Gandhi arrived in Nepal on Monday on a five-day private visit to the country. Gandhi, who arrived at the Tribhuvan International Airport Monday evening, is likely to visit some tourist spots during his stay. According to The Kathmandu Post newspaper, the Congress leader is in Kathmandu to attend the wedding of his Nepali friend Sumnima Udas, who is a former CNN correspondent.—PTI

Prashant Kishor Hints At Political Plunge from Bihar

New Delhi: Days after he turned down Congress party's offer to make him a member of its empowered committee, political strategist Prashant Kishor has said he is turning a new page after ten years of a "rollercoaster ride" in participating in the democracy to help shape pro-people policies. Kishor may reveal his plan in detail from Patna on Thursday.—Vasudha Venugopal

TO APPEAR FOR MANDATORY FOREIGN MEDICAL GRADUATE EXAM

MHA Okay Needed for Pak Med Degree Holders After 2018

New Delhi: Medical students who secured degrees from Pakistan universities after December 2018 will need security clearances from the home ministry to appear for Foreign Medical Graduate Examinations (FMGE), the National Medical Commission and Dental Council of India have said in directives issued on Monday.

The move follows reports that medical seats in Pakistan were 'allocated' to various separatist organisations in J&K, who charged money from aspirants and used it to fund terrorism. ET was the first to report, in its April 27 edition, that the Centre was considering a proposal to derecognise medical degrees from Pakistan.

"All concerned are advised not to travel to Pakistan for pursuing medical education. Any Indian national/overseas citizen of India who intends to take admission in MBBS/BDS or equivalent medical course in any medical college of Pakistan shall not be eligible for appearing in FMGE or seeking employment in India on the basis of educational qualifications acquired in Pakistan except those who had joined Pakistan degree colleges/institutions before December 2018 or later after obtaining security clearance from MHA till date," the NMC statement said.

The Dental Council of India too issued a similar statement.

Migrants and their children who have acquired medical degree or higher education in Pakistan and have been awarded Indian citizenship would, however, continue to be eligible for appearing in FMGE/NEXT or seeking employment in India after obtaining security clearance from the home ministry, the NMC and DCI said.
